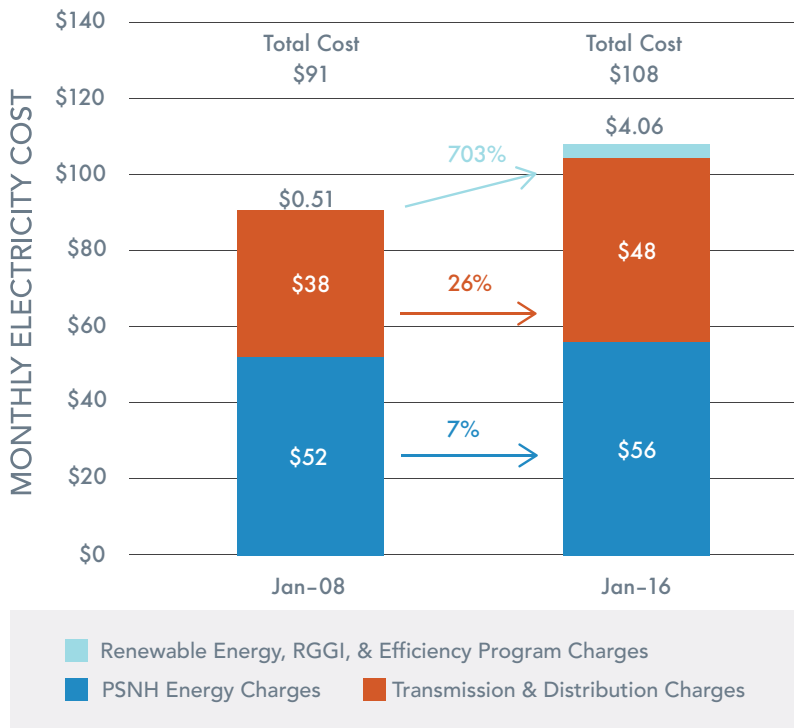
Electricity market benefits

New Hampshire has received tremendous benefits from participating in the New England electricity market through maximizing access to the most efficient resources in the region and increased reliability. Over the last several years, competition is also driving down wholesale electricity supply prices. And yet, consumers have not seen lower bills leaving many questions.

Because the Public Service Company of New Hampshire (PSNH) has owned rate-based generation, customers have seen increases in the electricity prices on their bills. In other states across New England, wholesale electricity prices on bills have actually decreased by double digit percentage points because they are able to access the most competitive prices in the wider marketplace. New Hampshire consumers will soon be able to do the same with PSNH looking to sell its utility owned plants.

Power generators are also driving massive reductions in carbon dioxide emissions leading to 32% reductions since 1990.

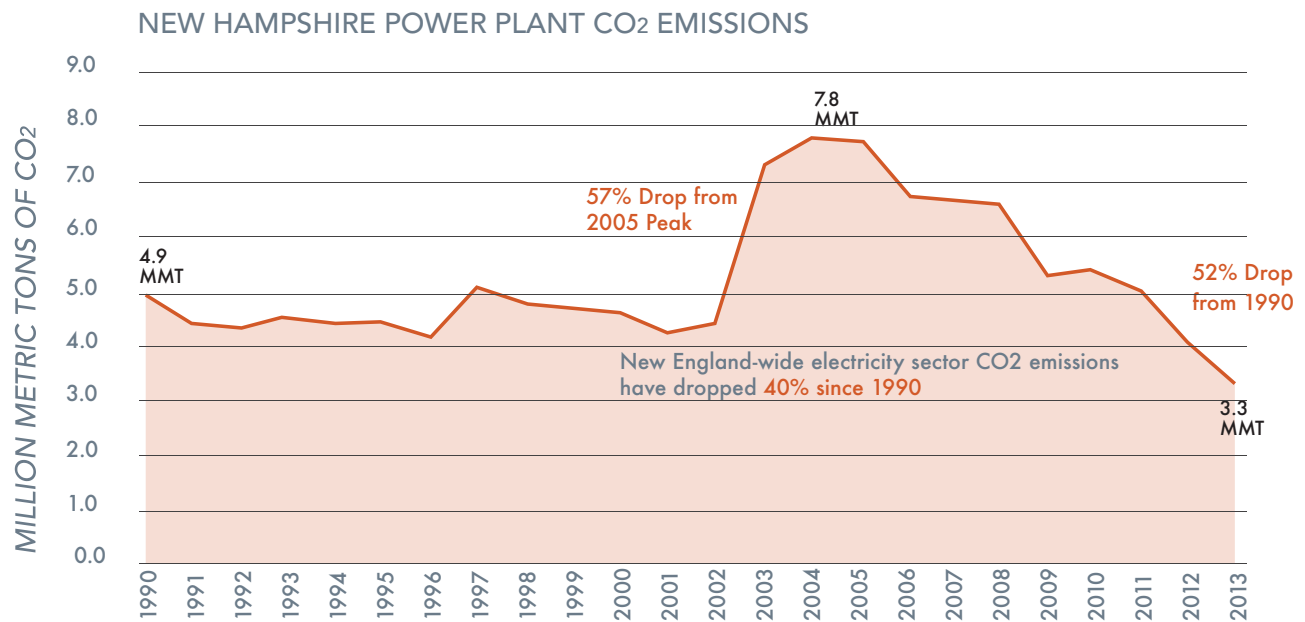
MONTHLY BILL FOR RESIDENTIAL EVERSOURCE NH CUSTOMER USING 600kWh/mo

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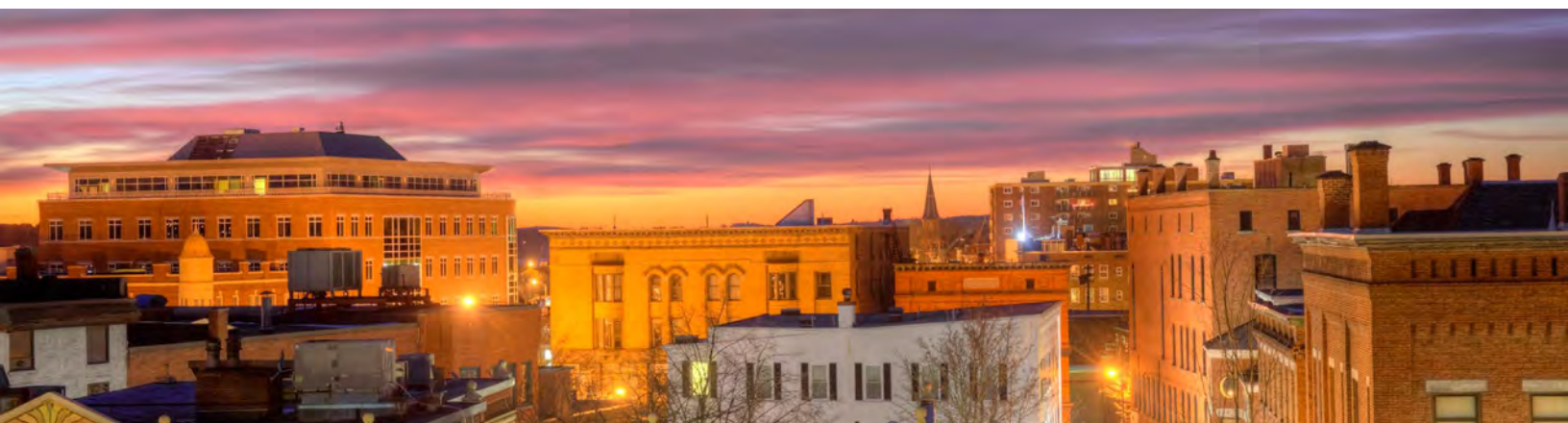
